Purpose

Background

The Heston in the Loop (HITL) project is aiming to create a circular economy demonstrator neighbourhood in Heston Village, LB Hounslow. The project is working with a number of partners to provide various activities in Heston Village. As part of the evaluation, Winning Moves is being provided with anonymised monitoring data, anonymised survey responses, and is undertaking online surveys, workshops and qualitative interviews with those delivering the interventions, and stakeholders. Winning Moves is conducting the final evaluation of Heston in the Loop. The purpose of the project is to understand if the HITL project is successful in making Heston more circular.

Data controller and data processors

For the purposes of this project:

1. LB Hounslow and ReLondon are the data controllers
2. Winning Moves is the data processor
3. Pook is also a data processor

Type of data that will be processed

For this project, we will process the following types of personal data:

1. Simple data including your name, email address, organisation name
2. Behavioural data including your experience with / thoughts / opinions / feedback on Heston in the Loop activities, performance, preferences and activities. Opinions may include financial opinions on increased or decreased income or turnover for example.
3. Anonymous sensitive data including ethnicity, sex, disability, age and employment status. To clarify, your personal identifiers (e.g. your name or address) will not be connected to any of your sensitive data.

How we get the personal data we process

Some of your personal information is provided from LB Hounslow and ReLondon and then additional personal data will be gained through you responding to the survey/workshop/ interview request.

The legal basis for processing your personal data

Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), the lawful bases we rely on for processing this information are

1. Public task: your contact details were shared with us by LB Hounslow and ReLondon as they require us to process your personal data to perform a public task. In this instance, it is to understand the impacts of circular economy activities in Heston and the impact that has on the environment.
2. Consent: prior to commencing the survey or interview with you, we explicitly seek your consent to collect and process your personal data. Informed consent is always collected by way of an affirmative action such as selecting 'next' to continue with a survey, a recorded verbal agreement when taking part in an interview, or an agreement in writing indicating that you would like to proceed with the research. You can withdraw your consent at any time by emailing dataprotection@winningmoves.com

How we will use your personal data

Any quotes will be anonymous. Data will be used for market and social research purposes: this includes carrying out analysis and producing reports on behalf of the client who has commissioned the survey. Results will be reported back to our client in an anonymised and aggregated format.

Will we share your personal data?

Your personal data will not be shared with any third party.

How we will keep your personal data

Your information will be securely stored. We will protect the confidentiality of your information in accordance with our normal data handling procedures and all legal requirements. We will not use it for any purposes other than those which are set out in this Notice. We are committed to keeping personal data secure and take all reasonable technical and organisational measures to protect personal data from loss, misuse or alteration.

The length of time we hold your personal information varies depending upon the type of information and its use. We will hold your personal information on our systems only for as long as necessary to provide research services to our clients, and will anonymise data where possible, securely deleting personal data associated with it at the earliest possible point. For this project, we intend to keep your anonymised sensitive data until one month after the final evaluation concludes (estimated September 2024). We will then dispose your information by secure digital deletion.

Where your personal data will be processed

Your data will not be transferred or stored outside the UK or European Economic Area.

Your Rights

Co-operation in research is voluntary at all times regardless of what the research is about or who our client is. You are entitled at any stage to ask that your personal data, or part or all of the record of your survey responses, be destroyed or deleted and we will carry out such a request. This can be requested during the interview itself or afterwards. You have the right to access any personal data that we process relating to you. We may ask for verification of your identity before releasing any information to you.
